Teacher's notes

Discussion

Students discuss the questions on the worksheet in pairs, groups or the activity can be handled as a whole class, teacher-centered discussion. Students can also mill around the classroom and ask different classmates. Another possibility is to pair the students and let them stand in two lines facing their partners. The teacher asks a question and students discuss it in their pair. Next, students standing in one line move one neighbour to the right and discuss the next question with their new partner and so on..

Picture based discussion

Students look at the pictures and choose one event they would like to visit this evening. Then they find someone who has chosen a different event from theirs. They want to spend the evening together so they need to persuade their partner that their event would be more fun.
