Task I:

Task II:

- 2. Copy a handout with pictures, give one to a pair of students and let them discuss why these pictures might be symbols of the USA.

- 1. Stars and Stripes. American flag, symbolizes first 13 states (stripes) and 50 current states of the USA (stars)
- 2. American natural beauties volcanoes in Yellowstone National Park, the oldest NP (founded in 1872)
- 3. Liberty Bell symbol of American independence, located in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania
- 4. Donkey symbol of the Democratic Party
- 5. Statue of Liberty on Liberty Island in New York, the gift of the French people to the Americans in 1886
- 6. American military force, controversial conflicts, Korean War (1950-1953), Vietnam War (1960s-1975), Gulf War (1990-1991), Afghanistan, etc..
- 7. Elephant symbol of the Republican Party
- 8. Native Americans indigenous (=original) inhabitants of the USA, numerous and various tribes and ethnic groups, many of them totally exterminated
- 9. The Capitol in Washington, DC the seat of the Congress of the USA
- 10. 9/11/2001 terrorist attack on the World Trade Centre in New York, start of the war against terrorism
- 11. 4th July Independence Day parades, fireworks, celebrations of the Declaration of Independence from 4/7/1776
- 12. Natural beauties in the USA Mt. Whitney (the highest peak in the continental states, in California 4421 m.) or Mt.McKinley (the highest peak of the USA in Alaska 6194 m)
- 13. Golden Gate Bridge suspension bridge in San Francisco, one of the technical wonders in the USA
- 14. The first man on the Moon Neil Armstrong in 1969. "That's one small step for a man, one giant leap for mankind."
- 15. Thanksgiving Day national holiday celebrated on the fourth Thursday after the first Monday in November to commemorate the first English settlements in North America (Pilgrim Fathers)
- 16. Barack Obama the first African-American President, elected for the second term in 2012
- 17. Hippies subculture in the late sixties, connected with Eastern philosophy, cultural diversity, music, protests against the Vietnam War
- 18. The Gold Rush discovery of gold in California in 1848 and Alaska in the 1860s led to enormous migration to the west
